Subject: Receipt of Reciprocal Recognition Fee

This letter is to inform you that this Division has received your Reciprocal Recognition Fee in the amount of **\$5,546.00**. You are granted a general license to conduct the activities authorized in your licensing document within Colorado for a period not in excess of 180 days in any calendar year. Your general license for reciprocity will expire **July 21, 2010**.

Pursuant to RH 3.24 of the *State of Colorado Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Radiation Control*, you are required to notify our office in writing at least three (3) days prior to each use of radioactive material in Colorado. Further, you must notify the Department within one (1) hour after arrival at the actual work location within the State, and notify the Department within one (1) hour after any change in work location within the State.

Special Condition(s). The following must be in the possession of the users at the work site: (1) a copy of the *State of Colorado Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Radiation Control*; (2) a copy of the Radioactive Materials License; (3) a complete inventory of sources brought into the State; (4) pertinent U.S.D.O.T documents; (5) leak test records for sources brought into the State; (6) instrument calibration records; and (7) personnel training records.
